ED MILLS ANNOUNCES TEN INITIATIVES FOR A STRONGER KENTUCKY

- ✓ Support downtown redevelopment in Bowling Green and possibly help jump start one for Morgantown.
- ✓ Promote Fiscal Responsibility in government at the state and local levels.
- ✓ Hold elected officials accountable for using ‘Common Sense Governing’ in their spending decisions.
- ✓ Create a team of innovative professionals for internal control and creating accountability in those responsible for spending state funds properly.
